Ethics Issues in Scholarship: Challenges, Reminders and Suggestions

Like other scholars and researchers, psychologists are required to follow ethics standards for their conduct. While some standards are very clear, others present a number of challenges and dilemmas. Dr. Barnett's presentation will review basic standards for ethical practice in research and scholarship, and then address ethical dilemmas and challenges. Issues to be focused on include publication credit, conflicts of interest, and plagiarism. Specific recommendations for training, oversight, and preventive strategies will be discussed.



Dr. Barnett is pleased to make his first visit to SUNY Oneonta since graduating from the College with a B.S. degree in Psychology in 1979. He received his master's and doctorate degrees in Clinical Psychology from the Ferkauf Graduate School of Yeshiva University, NY, NY. Dr. Barnett is a full professor of psychology at Loyola University Maryland and a licensed psychologist in private practice. Board certified by the American Board of Professional Psychology in Clinical Psychology and in Clinical Child and Adolescent Psychology, he is also a Distinguished Practitioner of Psychology in the National Academies of Practice. Dr. Barnett is the recipient of the 2009 American Psychological Association Award for Distinguished Contributions to the Independent Practice of Psychology, and has held numerous leadership positions in the psychology profession. With expertise in ethics, legal, mentoring, and professional practice issues in psychology, he is the author of many journal articles and chapters, and four books for psychologists and other mental health professionals.
